## TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BAR

### NEW RULES OF PROCEDURE AVAILABLE AT THE PROTHONOTARY'S OFFICE

Each member of the bar may obtain at the office of the Prothonotary of the Court of Common Pleas a copy of the Rules of Procedure promulgated by the Supreme Court and made effective on September 4, 1939, on the following four topics:

Actions by Real Parties in Interest (Rules 2001 to 2025)

Minors as Parties (Rules 2026 to 2050)

Actions for Wrongful Death (Rules 2201 to 2225)

Joinder of Additional Parties (Rules 2251 to 2275)

Also, if not already obtained, a copy of the Rules of Court which became effective on March 20, 1939.

Printed copies of all Rules of Procedure which may hereafter be adopted by the Supreme Court can be obtained upon application to the Prothonotary of the Court of Common Pleas of each district.

Under an Order of the Supreme Court all of these rules will be printed from time to time in the Pennsylvania Supreme Court Reports.
