Recently, particularly during the present emergency, a great number of young lawyers and students coming out of law schools have been taking an increasing interest in the work of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, not a few of them with an eye to applying for membership in that organization. Feeling that there are undoubtedly many such men included among our readers, we thought that it would be of interest to them to know that applications are being accepted by the Bureau the positions as special agents. The basic requirements are that the applicant be:

1. A male citizen of the United States
2. A graduate of a recognized law school
3. Between twenty-three and thirty-five years of age
4. At least five feet seven inches tall.

The salary is \$3,200 a year.

Those interested in applying for these positions may receive additional information and application blanks by writing to the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Department of Justice, Washington, D. C.
