## **Resolution of the Board of Trustees of the Dickinson School of Law**

**WHEREAS**, all who knew him were deeply saddened by the untimely death of Edgar I. King, Dean of the Dickinson School of Law on the fifteenth day of September 1977; and

**WHEREAS**, Edgar I. King distinguished himself as a capable legal educator of the highest integrity and compassion and as an administrator whose fairness and professionalism earned great distinction for the Dickinson School of Law; and

**WHEREAS**, he provided leadership in his community through his enthusiasm and insight and further enhanced the reputation of the Dickinson School of Law; and

**WHEREAS**, he uniquely blended his knowledge and enthusiasm for life and the law with a humbleness in which he regarded his students as his friends, thereby increasing their appreciation of both the man and the law; and

**WHEREAS**, the sunshine of his intelligence as professor and administrator and his love as husband and friend have shone brilliantly upon the Dickinson School of Law; and

**WHEREAS**, Edgar I. King served the Dickinson School of Law loyally and faithfully for fifteen years as Professor, Assistant Dean, and Dean, causing all of those who knew him to be warmed by his friendship and bringing credit as a citizen, veteran, and husband upon himself and the Dickinson School of Law;

**BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of the Dickinson School of Law expresses its deep sense of loss at his death and its sympathy to his wife Ann and that this resolution be spread upon its minutes in perpetuation of his memory and a copy be sent to his wife.
