Resolution of the Faculty of the Dickinson School of Law

WHEREAS, Edgar I. King, Dean of the Dickinson School of Law, died at the age of sixty-three on the fifteenth day of September, 1977; and

WHEREAS, Edgar I. King was an outstanding lawyer, educator, and administrator who by his skill, insight, integrity, and compassionate nature brought great honor and prestige to the profession of law and to the Dickinson School of Law; and

WHEREAS, he gave unselfishly of his time and talent assisting and inspiring students and faculty to greater accomplishments and a deeper appreciation of the law; and

WHEREAS, he participated actively in community activities which greatly benefited the residents of the area and enhanced the reputation of the Dickinson School of Law; and

WHEREAS, he served as a member of the American Law Institute, the American Bar Association, and the Association of American Law Schools; and

WHEREAS, his reputation as a conscientious, capable, and intelligent legal educator was matched only by his reputation as a loving husband and devoted friend; and

WHEREAS, Edgar I. King served the Dickinson School of Law loyally and faithfully as Professor, Assistant Dean, and Dean for fifteen years, causing all of those who knew him to be warmer from his personality and bringing credit as a citizen, veteran, and husband upon himself and the said Dickinson School of Law;

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED that the faculty of the Dickinson School of Law, through this resolution, expresses its keen sense of loss at his death and its sympathy to his wife, Ann, and his family.
