Eulogy

Kurt H. Decker, a prolific author on labor law and an exceptional scholar, educator and practicing attorney, died suddenly at the age of 53 years on May 1, 2000. A frequent contributor to the Dickinson Law Review, Mr. Decker was an adjunct professor at the Harrisburg campuses of Widener University School of Law and St. Francis College. He earned his law degree from Vanderbilt University in 1976 and a Master of Laws degree in labor law from Temple University in 1980. First employed as an Assistant Attorney General in the Pennsylvania Governor's Office, Bureau of Labor Relations, Mr. Decker associated with Stevens & Lee, Reading, Pennsylvania in 1979, thereafter became a shareholder and practiced labor and municipal law with the firm until his death. He is survived by his wife Hilary and two children, Christian and Allison.
